Some of the statements I made in my principal's address during the first concert included :

- "Our CFD program, including the performance and 'food from around the world', will provide our multicultural public school with the opportunity to celebrate the unique nature of our school's learning community, to showcase some of the talents of our students, teachers and parents, and provide us with the very important opportunity to develop even closer links with our parents and the wider community".
- "In our multicultural public schools like Auburn North, we don't just accept and tolerate other cultures, we **recognise** each other's cultures, we **respect** each other's cultures, and we **encourage** each other to take great pride in their cultures, and together we celebrate each other's unique and special cultures every school day. Gloria, one of our year 6 students, wrote last week, "**Our school is lucky to be multicultural. If you look around you and ask yourself, 'Is everyone the same?', your answer would be, 'No, we're all very lucky to be different'**". However, only in inclusive multicultural public schools such as ANPS can today's children and tomorrow's adults learn one of life's most important lessons;... and the lesson is that regardless of a person's culture, religion or colour, we are all essentially the same with the same needs and wants".
- "Recently, two students wrote why they thought ANPS was 'The Best of All Worlds'. They wrote:

'What I like about Auburn North Public School, the school which provides 'THE BEST OF ALL WORLDS', is that it is so multicultural.

I come to school every day knowing that I'm going to learn something new, not only in education, but that I will also learn something new every day about the cultures of the world. This is what makes Auburn North so special'.

Our 2nd student wrote:

'One reason why I like Auburn North is because you are given the freedom to do what you believe in. I think that is very important because everyone has different beliefs and to live in a harmonious community we MUST respect the beliefs of others. That is what makes Auburn North really 'The Best of All Worlds'.'

- "Multicultural public schools, like our school, educate the whole child, emotionally, socially, physically and most definitely academically. Auburn North is an example of an outstanding multicultural public school learning community with its perfect mix of families and staff from around the world, where highly motivated and professional teachers, delightful, appreciative and bright students, and lovely, supportive parents teach and learn together harmoniously to produce a school culture based on high expectations, high standards and high achievements".
- "As a result of all ANPS community members, that is, students, staff and parents, working together harmoniously, our multicultural school has achieved outstanding academic results over many years. In this year's NAPLAN tests, in terms of our student growth in our District of 15 schools, we achieved:
 - ❖ 2nd greatest growth in Reading
 - ❖ 2nd greatest growth in Grammar and Punctuation; and
 - ❖ 4th greatest growth in Numeracy".
- "I believe our parents from around the world share the view that was expressed by Mr Quadri last week when he sent the following email to me:

'Dear respected ANPS Staff,

I would like to thank you all for the utmost care you take with my children. I have a very high regard for your school and I am proud to write that my children attend the best school in NSW which has the best values and highest standards".

- "And finally, I believe that our outstanding school is a **MODEL** for all schools and communities in Australia and around the world, and I believe that our world would be a lot more peaceful and fair if all individuals and communities followed our lead".

EXTENDED LEAVE

With only six school weeks to go before the end of the 2011 school year, (Friday 16th December) we have started to form our 2012 classes. To ensure that there will be minimal changes to our classes early in term 1 we ask that you contact our office as soon as possible if:

1. you will be moving to another suburb during the holidays and that your child/children will NOT be attending our school next year.
2. you will be going on an overseas holiday during the school holidays and your child/children will not be returning to school on Monday, 30th January (1st day of 2012 school year) but WILL be returning to school later in the term.

This is a reminder to parents that children should be attending school every day. If you are planning a holiday or need to travel overseas, this should be organised with the least disruption to your child's education as possible. Parents who need to travel with their child need to complete an 'Exemption from School' form at least 6 weeks prior to travel. These forms are available from the office. We also require a copy of your travel arrangements (airline ticket). Failure to complete this form may result in your child being referred to the Home School Liaison Officer.
