Twelve of our senior students last week participated in the prestigious 3-day NSW Schools' Spectacular. The Spectacular has been held for the past 28 years but this year is the first year our school has been involved. Many schools and thousands of students auditioned for the Spectacular but only the most talented were selected. Our school was selected.

Our students danced in two night performances and two matinee (daytime) performances at the Sydney Entertainment Centre.

Our dancers stayed in Sydney on Friday and Saturday night with our teachers and enjoyed dinner and lunch in restaurants but also cooked pancakes and made hamburgers in their apartments. What an experience for them!
